## From the Registrar

Welcome to the mid-year edition of Registration Buzz.

As a teacher in South Australia, you must be registered with the Teachers Registration Board (the Board) and this means that at some time, all teachers in schools or early childhood settings will have contact with us in some capacity. However, many may not know exactly what it is that we do.

The Board is a specialist body that regulates the teaching profession in South Australia to ensure quality teaching and provides for the safety and wellbeing of children and young people. The Board's mission is to foster a profession of capable and effective teachers who are well prepared to teach, are supported in their professional growth, and who practice at a consistently high standard.

Teacher registration ensures a minimum quality standard is applied to all teachers entering or currently teaching in South Australia. Registration verifies you as a qualified teaching professional.

While the Board primarily registers teachers, it also provides a wide range of other statutory functions that are mandated by legislation to ensure only qualified and suitable persons are eligible to work in South Australian schools and early childhood settings. The Board also approves and accredits initial teacher education and supports beginner teachers to develop their practice through professional standards.

Another function of the Board is to investigate instances of unprofessional conduct, incompetence, or lack of suitability to teach. The Board must have the welfare and best interests of children as its paramount consideration.

The Board, as regulator, is committed to ensuring that quality teaching and excellence in education is maintained through best teaching practice.

## Code of Conduct Update

Staff at the Teachers Registration Board have been working to progress materials from our recent Consultation Launch in the form of a Discussion Paper that comprises our next phase of consultation. The Code of Conduct Discussion Paper is in the last stages of development and will be available for feedback in July.

Once published, the Discussion Paper will be available on the Board's website, but if you would like to be added to our distribution list please let us know, via email to [consultation@trb.sa.edu.au](mailto:consultation@trb.sa.edu.au), and a copy will be emailed directly to you.

There will be further opportunities to attend follow-up consultation sessions. Registration for these sessions will be available on the Code of Conduct page of our website at the same time as the Discussion Paper.

Keeping your contact details up to date is an important obligation of your teacher registration. The Board regularly sends updates throughout the year to your email, however if your email has changed and you haven't advised us, these important messages may not reach you.



## Upcoming Registration

Getting your Application for Renewal of Registration processed quickly and efficiently is our priority. In order to ensure that your 2023 application can be submitted and processed, we recommend that you begin now to prepare the supporting documentation that will be required.

Your Application for Renewal of Registration will be available on your Teachers Portal from **10 October 2022 until 31 December 2022**. You can log into the portal at <https://online.trb.sa.edu.au/default.aspx> If you don't have a personal portal login, you will need to create one.

An email would have been sent to you earlier this month, so please check what supporting information you will need to provide to ensure that your supporting documents are ready for submission after 10 October and your registration can be processed in a timely manner.

### Lodgement of your Application

You can lodge your renewal application online via the portal from 10 October 2022. You have until 31 December 2022 to

submit your application. A late fee will apply if you lodge your application after 31 December 2022.


